

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



Baptism/Bautismo: We celebrate the baptism of infants & young children on the third Sunday of the month during the 11:00AM mass. Baptism class is held the first Wednesday of the month. Come to the office to talk to a staff person to register for baptism Please bring Birth Certificate when you come in to register. Call us or visit our website for more information.

Marriage: Couples should make an appointment at least 6 months in advance of possible date. Please call the Rectory and make an appointment with the priest.

Sacrament of the Sick- Please call and let us know if a family member is sick and would like to be anointed.

Faith Formation for All— Our Religious Education classes are held on Sunday Mornings (10:00 a.m.) for children in grades 1-8. In addition families are *expected* to participate in monthly Family Faith Days WITH their children, as well as Family Mass on the First Sat of each month (Oct-May) at 5p.m.

Children will participate in the program for a minimum of 2 years to prepare for sacraments.

Monday classes (4:00 p.m.) are offered for those older youngsters and their families who are seeking sacraments of initiation.

Initiation for Adults (R.C.I.A.)—Adults who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith gather on Monday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the parish house. The door is always open to newcomers. All questions welcome

America Magazine Article

On Feb 14, 2018 America Media/Magazine printed an article by Fr Jack Bentz, SJ titled:

"Dear regular Mass-goers: the seats at the end of the pew aren't for you."

In his article Fr. Bentz goes on to explain quite well that as faithful church going Catholics we say a lot about what we REALLY feel by where we sit in church.

He states very clearly that we can have the best greeters at the doors with the kindest smiles, but if we make folks climb over us to get into the pews...we've said the exact opposite of what we want to proclaim about new comers being welcome. He even goes so far as to suggest that **sitting in the middle of the pew is a sign of hope**, hope that others will actually come and join us in prayer and worship.

With allowances being made for our elderly and those families who need to move around with children, we want to encourage each other to take this idea of where we sit in church to heart.

We know that we have heard this idea so often, that we are a welcoming community, that we want to be even better at making the stranger feel at home among us. How the very act of where we sit in church helps us proclaim by our actions what we believe! We can't hear often enough how "moving to the middle" physically as well as ideologically, makes so much sense in our fast paced, stress filled world.

We invite you to find and read this article in America magazine and take some time to pray about how you want your actions in church to proclaim what you believe. Is there room in your pew for someone to pray with you? Is there room in your heart?
