


## Mission Statement

## SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



**Baptism/Bautismo:** We celebrate the baptism of infants & young children on the third Sunday of the month during the 11:00AM mass. Baptism class is held the first Wednesday of the month. Bautizos en Español son celebrados el tercer Domingo del mes a las 12:30PM. Come to the office to talk to a staff person to register for baptism Please bring Birth Certificate when you come in to register. Call us or visit our website for more information.

**Marriage:** Couples should make an appointment at least 6 months in advance of possible date. Please call the Rectory and make an appointment with the priest.

**Sacrament of the Sick-** Please call and let us know if a family member is sick and would like to be anointed.

**Faith Formation for All-** Our Religious Education classes are held on Sunday Mornings (10:00 a.m.) for children in grades 1-8. In addition families are *expected* to participate in monthly Family Faith Days WITH their children, as well as Family Mass on the First Sat of each month (Oct-May) at 5p.m.

Children will participate in the program for a minimum of 2 years to prepare for sacraments.

Monday classes (4:00 p.m.) are offered for those older youngsters and their families who are seeking sacraments of initiation.

**Initiation for Adults (R.C.I.A.)**—Adults who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith gather on Monday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the parish house. The door is always open to newcomers. All questions welcome

## Are Our Hearts Ready for Holy Week?

As we enter into Palm Sunday and Holy Week 2018 we ask ourselves, are we ready? Where did this Lenten Season go? How did we do with our Lenten resolutions? Are we ready to celebrate the resurrection? Having just returned from the country's largest Religious Education Conference (35,000 people) my heart and my mind are quite overwhelmed with the vastness of God's generosity to us. I listened to much about how "the Church" needs to pay better attention to our Young Adults, the ones who are here with us, folks looking to join, and the ones who don't seem to want to come through the doors. I come home so proud to be a part of THIS parish, and am grateful for the privilege of being in ministry here with you.

Holy Week offers us a yearly opportunity to share our story, this amazing story of Christ's love for us, with someone who has maybe never heard or has forgotten this good news.

Monday evening we have a chance to reconcile our hearts to God's own in the sacrament of reconciliation. Is this the right time for you to come right? To come home if you've felt estranged?

Thursday evening we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. We revisit that Passover night that changed the history of our world, when bread and wine were transformed into Christ's own Body and blood. A night when humble, scared fishermen, tax collectors and poor men and women had their hearts broken open to the great reality of God's love. Come pray with us on Thursday evening, have your feet washed as a sign of your willingness to step anew into the fullness life God is calling you to. Bow down low before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration of the One who has loved us first.

A young man asked me why we call Good Friday "Good". I explained that the amazing amount of love God has for us is what we celebrate when we tell the story of Jesus' last hours, his suffering and death. The empty church, the starkness of the cross, the silence, all create a space in our hearts and minds to remember, to be grateful for, and to recommit ourselves to a life of love, despite the cost. As Jesus loved us, we are called to love others. Come pray with us on Friday at 3pm or 6pm and walk again this journey of love. Bring a friend.

Holy Saturday we begin our great celebration with the Easter Vigil. Here we bless water and fire, primordial symbols of our humanity. Once blessed these become signs of divinity for us. We are thrilled to welcome into our family two young men who have been waiting for this night for over a year. Muhan and Ramel will walk into the waters of baptism and emerge as new Catholics, one with us for the first time at the table of the Lord. With them, we renew our baptismal promises and step into the Easter Season with hearts burning with the love of the God who has carried us through another Lent.

As you look back over the last 40 days, what is different for you? As a parish we have seen new babies born, young people confirmed and little ones preparing for Eucharist. We have prayed Vespers together, we've worshipped weekly. There have been good days and sorrowful days. How are you different because of the Lent you have celebrated? Why not invite a friend to join you at church? As we pray together this Holy Week let us ask God to help us get our minds and hearts ready for the wonder of the Resurrection.


