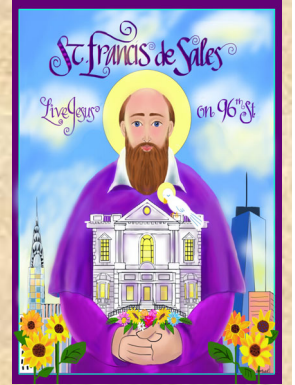

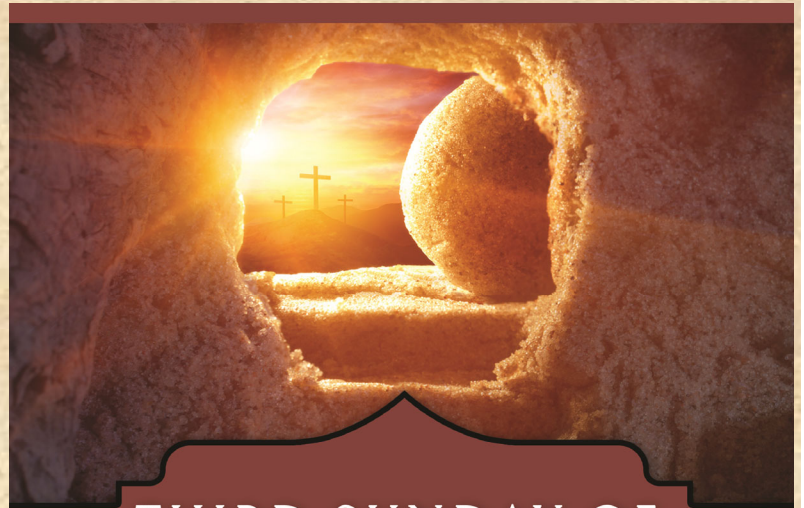

Baptism/Bautismo: We celebrate the baptism of infants & young children on the third Sunday of the month during the 11:00AM mass. Baptism class is held the first Wednesday of the month. Bautizos en Español son celebrados el tercer Domingo del mes a las 12:30PM. **Come to the office to talk to a staff person to register for baptism Please bring Birth Certificate when you come in to register. Call us or visit our website for more information.**

Marriage: Couples should make an appointment at least 6 months in advance of possible date. Please call the Rectory and make an appointment with the priest.

Sacrament of the Sick- Please call and let us know if a family member is sick and would like to be anointed.

Faith Formation for All- Our Religious Education classes are held on Sunday Mornings (10:00 a.m.) for children in grades 1-8. In addition families are *expected* to participate in monthly Family Faith Days WITH their children, as well as Family Mass on the First Sat of each month (Oct-May) at 5p.m.

Children will participate in the program for a minimum of 2 years to prepare for sacraments.

Monday classes (4:00 p.m.) are offered for those older youngsters and their families who are seeking sacraments of initiation.

Initiation for Adults (R.C.I.A.)—Adults who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith gather on Monday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the parish house. The door is always open to newcomers. All questions welcome

Staff Corner Our Easter Season


Happy Easter! “But, Bradley,” you say, “Easter was two weeks ago.” You’re not wrong. But as Catholics, we have a way of making seasons stretch. By example, we celebrate the Christmas season liturgically not just until Epiphany but until the Baptism of Our Lord—well into January.

As a Church, we celebrate the Easter season from sunset on Easter Vigil until Pentecost—this year on May 20. That’s seven weeks of rejoicing! Let the symbolism of the calendar bring you joy as well. We marched through the desert for 40 days, but on the other side is 50 days of celebration. Quite literally, the joy of Easter lasts longer than the sacrifice of Lent. So it should be in our hearts.

At its roots, this season helped continue the formation of newly-welcomed Christians. But even for the seasoned Catholic, the language of our liturgy during this time speaks to new life and inspired discipleship. Listen to the first readings during the next month, and you will hear a series of accounts from the Acts of the Apostles. These readings recount the earliest days of the Church. How did the leaders of that Church respond to circumstances? How did the earliest followers come to believe? How did Jesus’ teachings give way to actions?

Until Pentecost, Happy Easter.

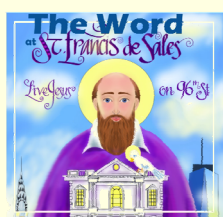

Durante todo el Tiempo Pascual, las tres lecturas del domingo son tomadas del Nuevo Testamento, la parte cristiana de la Sagrada Escritura. Juntas exploran qué significa creer que Jesús es el Cristo, aquél que cumplió las profecías de la Sagrada Escritura judía. Las selecciones de hoy aluden a nuestra debilidad humana; sin embargo, hacen hincapié en el perdón y la paz que son posibles para quienes tienen fe en "Jesucristo, el Justo" (1 Juan 2:2).
