



Saturday, January 12, 2019 | 6:00 PM & 8:00 PM in the Parish Hall



In anticipation of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, we'll be reading a selection of his sermons that explore his commitment to social justice and the theology that rooted his political mission.

January 6, 2019 The Epiphany of the Lord

Tradition, poetry, and literature have long reflected upon the story of the magi. The journey of the magi indeed resonates with journeys in our own lives. The journey is a search for a "king," for what or who is of primary importance in life. The seekers lose direction and encounter obstacles and dangers. Searching for a king, the magi first come upon a false king, Herod. The reappearance of the star shows them the true path and leads to the true king.

For Matthew, the journey culminates in the magi's worship of Jesus. They discover a king not clothed in grandeur, but wrapped in humility and simplicity. They begin to re-imagine what true royal power really is. Transformed by the journey, they embrace the humble king, Jesus.



INSIDERS AND OUTSIDERS

An epiphany is a manifestation, a revelation of what was hidden, and often a challenge to change. For Matthew's community, the story of the magi challenged these new Christians, from both Jewish and Gentile origin. The insiders, those rooted in the Jewish scriptures and traditions, might be uncomfortable with the magi, and with God working within Gentile culture to draw them toward God. The outsiders, the Gentiles, would rejoice that God calls them from within their own roots. But they knew that they too were called to their own journey of transformation.

Who are insiders and outsiders today? Some might see strangers as threats to accustomed ways of honoring and serving God. Others might believe that they themselves are too distant, concluding that they cannot be accepted in Christian community, and perhaps tune out God's activity in their lives. Still others might think that belief in Christ serves as another dividing line between people, preventing them from seeing all persons as God's children. The story of the Epiphany reminds us that classifying insiders and outsiders is an illusion, a falsehood arising from a separation from God. When we are united with God, we can only see others as sisters and brothers.

6 de enero de 2019 La Epifanía del Señor

La tradición, la poesía y la literatura desde hace mucho tiempo reflexionan en la historia de los magos. El camino de los magos sin duda tiene impacto en los caminos de nuestras propias vidas. El camino es una búsqueda de un "rey", por lo qué o por quién es de una importancia fundamental en la vida. Quienes buscan pierden la dirección y encuentran obstáculos y peligros. Al buscar a un rey, los magos primero llegan con un rey engañoso, Herodes. La reaparición de la estrella muestra el verdadero camino y los guía al verdadero rey.

Para Mateo, el camino termina cuando los magos adoran a Jesús. Ellos descubren a un rey que no está vestido de majestuosidad, sino cubierto con humildad y sencillez. Ellos comienzan a reimaginar lo que es el verdadero poder regio. Transformados por este camino, ellos aceptan a este rey humilde, Jesús.

INCLUIDOS Y EXCLUIDOS

Una epifanía es una manifestación, una revelación de lo que estaba escondido, y a menudo un desafío a cambiar. Para la comunidad de Mateo, la historia de los magos desafía a estos nuevos cristianos, tanto aquellos de origen judío como a los que no son judíos. Los incluidos, aquellos enraizados en las tradiciones y Escrituras judías, podrían estar incómodos con los magos, y con Dios obrando en la cultura de aquellos que no son judíos y que se acercan a Dios. Los excluidos, también llamados gentiles, se alegran de que Dios los llame desde sus propias raíces. Excepto que ellos también saben que están llamados a sus propios caminos de transformación.

¿Hoy en día, quiénes son los incluidos y los excluidos? Algunos podrían ver a los fuereños como amenazas a las formas acostumbradas de honrar y servir a Dios. Otros podrían creer que ellos mismos están muy alejados, concluyendo que no pueden ser aceptados en la comunidad cristiana, y quizás dejen de prestar atención a la obra de Dios en sus vidas. Aun así, otros podrían pensar que creer en Cristo sirve como otra línea que divide a las personas, previniéndolas de ver a todas las personas como hijos de Dios. La historia de la Epifanía nos recuerda que clasificar a personas como incluidas o excluidas es una ilusión, una mentira que surge a partir de una separación de Dios. Cuando estamos unidos con Dios, solo podemos ver a los demás como hermanos y hermanas.
